General Information

SANTA FE

One of the most unique and historic cities in the U.S., Santa Fe (<http://www.sdct.itl.nist.gov/~ftp/l8/sc32wg2/2000/events/openforum/santafe.htm>) is located in northern New Mexico at an elevation of 7,000 feet (2,100 meters) in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains, with nearby peaks as high as 12,000 feet.

Santa Fe has a rich and varied history. Founded in 1607, it is the oldest capital city in America, and the oldest European community west of the Mississippi River. In recent years Santa Fe has become one of the premier tourist destinations in the U.S. It is a sophisticated city of 60,000 which offers 200 restaurants, 150 art galleries, 50 Native American jewelry shops, 13 major museums, and a world famous opera company. CLIMATE

In January the average high temperature in Santa Fe is 40F/4C and the average low is 19F/-7C. Snow is to be expected this time of the year, and world class skiing is available near Santa Fe. (<http://www.skisantafe.com/>).

Electrical voltage is 120 AC 60 cycles, with U.S. style three pin. A number of electrical extension cords and multiple outlet power strips will be available for use in the meeting rooms. AIRPORT INFORMATION

Most participants will fly into the Albuquerque International Sunport Airport (<http://www.cabq.gov/airport>) and take ground transportation to the hotel. Albuquerque International Airport is approximately one hour's drive from Santa Fe.

- Sandia Shuttle provides daily service from Sunport Airport to the La Fonda Hotel at a cost of \$20 one-way. Reservations must be made in advance by calling 505-474-5696.
- Grey Line of Albuquerque provides daily shuttle service from Sunport Airport to the La Fonda Hotel at a cost of \$25 one-way. Reservations must be made at least 24-hours in advance by calling 800-256-8991 or 505-242-3880.
- Local limousine service is provided by Limotion Santa Fe at 505-820-0816. Approximate limousine charges for one-way service from Sunport Airport to the La Fonda Hotel is \$126 inclusive of tax.

The oldest public building in the United States.

Georgia O'Keeffe Museum, 217 Johnson Street, Santa Fe, NM 87501
Well done and beautiful presentation of O'Keeffe's work.

St. Francis Cathedral, 231 Cathedral Place, Santa Fe, NM 87501
Romanesque-style cathedral, which is a rare departure from the Pueblo architecture.

Museum of Fine Arts, West Palace Avenue, Santa Fe, NM 87501
A Pueblo Revival-style structure completed in 1917—one of the best regional museums in the United States.

La Fonda Hotel, East San Francisco Street, Santa Fe, NM 87501
A must see experience. This landmark hotel was a gathering place for cowboys, traders, soldiers, and all the other frontier folk that frequented Santa Fe. It is known as the "The Inn at the End of the Trail."

Loretto Chapel, 211 Old Santa Fe Trail, Santa Fe, NM
A Romanesque church modeled after the Sainte-Chapelle chapel in Paris. The chapel is known for the "Miraculous Staircase."

Canyon Road - This is a real must. Lined with artists and shops famous around the world.
