Please accept this email as a formal request for Category A liaison from ECCMA to JTC1/SC32.

ECCMA is working with NATO AC135 (<a href="http://www.nato.int/structur/AC/135/welcome.htm">http://www.nato.int/structur/AC/135/welcome.htm</a>) on the development of the ECCMA Open Technical Dictionary (eOTD). The eOTD is an open standard descriptive language that contains over 60,000 Standard Item Names and over 30,000 Standard Attribute Names, with definitions, and multilingual translations. The eOTD is used to create standardized language independent descriptions of individuals, organizations, locations, goods and services using simple attribute-value pairs. ECCMA is working with TC184/SC4 on a project to incorporate cataloging data, which references the eOTD, into STEP (ISO 10303) data. We would like to work with SC32 to explore the application of ISO 11179 to the eOTD, as well as explore how the eOTD harmonization process could be included in the standards managed by SC32.
